

Bay Harbor's Harbor and Channel

Howdy Neighbors

I am writing you in hopes of generating your interest and help to get our harbor and channel to the bay navigable again. As many of you may recall, about 10 years ago, Betsy Redfield championed the last dredging project for our bay access entrance channel. The results of that endeavor was a new, diverted channel and the enhancement of our Bird Island. It was a huge success and with the Galveston Bay Foundations planting of sea grasses and some help from mother nature, our immediate bay front is a thriving example of enhanced ecosystem through marsh restoration.

Over these past 10 years since the projects completion, we have endured storms and tidal events that have caused some erosion of our shoreline and in particular Bird Island. The effect of the erosion is that our channel has sanded up at several locations limiting navigation in the channel especially on low tides. So the time has come to do a maintenance dredge.

About a year ago, I began attending meetings with a group of west end subdivision directors, whose respective subdivisions had bay access channels that that were sanding up and in need of a maintenance dredge. We collectively formed "The West Galveston Island Entrance Channel Dredging and Marsh Restoration Group.". In total, there were 9 subdivisions involved in the group. As a collective, the group, as advised by our technical advisor, Cherie O'Brien of Texas Parks and Wildlife, has made application to a number of groups for grant funding to accomplish the task for all 9 subdivisions. Texas Parks and Wildlife is wholly in favor of this project for the group because of the tremendous benefits that marsh restoration creates.

As Bay Harbor's group of subdivisions do not at this time have a mandatory Home Owners Association, we do not have the power to levy any kind of maintenance tax to fund payment for anything that improves our "Bay Harbor". We do have the Bay Harbor Improvement Association (BHIA), a civic club, that owns the land that the pavilion is built on, and some of the land surrounding the harbor itself. BHIA owns and maintains the boat ramp, fishing pier, some of the boat slips and finger piers, and pays the water surface annual lease to the State of Texas for the right to have a channel and a ground lease on "Bird Island" as was a requirement to place the dredge spoils on. BHIA also maintains the lighting around the harbor area as well as the entrance signs at the street entrances to Bay Harbor from FM 3005. All of this is done with the meager funds (\$150 /yr) that are received as membership dues. Unfortunately, not everyone in the subdivision participates or believes in the cause so as a result of the inability to levy maintenance taxes, we are forced to resort to fund raising when ever a costly project presents itself.

Ahh fund raising. I know that most everyone has had their share of experiences with the subject and probably roll their eyes at the mention of it. Never the less, if we want to again have an open channel and harbor, it is something we must discuss and the time is now! I would like to have the board call a special meeting in the very near future to be held at our pavilion, weather permitting, for an open forum discussion of all of the particulars relating to getting a maintenance dredge done. I will invite Cherie O'Brien of TEXAS PARKS AND WILDLIFE to speak along with Jerry Mohn, the president of the WGIPOA, or West Galveston Island Property Owners Association. We will present all of the information that we currently have available, including anticipated costs and expectations.

I look forward to seeing a lot of you there with great questions, enthusiasm and willingness to help make this a success.
