Once the box is finished, it will be mounted at the pavilion and added to the world-wide Little Free Library map and will be the eleventh library on the island. ay 15th, 2019 Albert Einstein is widely credited with claiming "The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again, but expecting different results". It truly doesn't make a difference that there's no proof that Einstein really put forth this expression; it's still an awesome quote! Al had to have fished. I'll bet you dollars to donuts a couple of fishermen spawned the quote. If you've fished West Bay in April or within the last year the quote has become your mantra. In fact, it was last month, I came across several fishermen meandering aimlessly, sweating profusely in their waders, the Styrofoam ball of their empty stringer dragging and bouncing on the asphalt of 3005. Mumbling phrases like "they were here yesterday" and "7 lbs, that's as big as baby". Of course I gave them a ride to their vehicle and made sure they hydrated appropriately. You know what they say, How can you tell when a fisherman's lyin? When his lips are moving...That's why I am writing the

fishing report.

Since the 1st of May fishing has been pretty good and improving. I'll go out in the yard this evening and kill a chicken




as to not jinx the upcoming trout run, no worries Brah! Seriously, I'm looking forward to Memorial Day tide-runners. The last week billions of shad have filled the marina and canals bursting into silver clouds as schools of trout ravage them from below. It's been crazy business all night with several good size trout caught from the dock


on silver Mirrolure Mirrodines. A Mirrordine is an imitation shad suspending twitch bait that you can easily purchase at any Academy. The plastic bait will sink about a foot or two beneath the surface and by twitching your rod tip the bait rises and wobbles toward the surface and then falls slowly back to suspend in the middle of the water column. You will feel a distinct thump or tap when the trout hits the bait and usually it's when the bait is descending. The second you feel the tap, raise your rod tip slowly and begin retrieving your line. As the line becomes taut, gradually increase the speed of retrieve and rod pressure on the fish. Do not land the fish to quickly. Let the fish pull and swim for a minute or two and expend some energy. Even after a couple of minutes the fish will be coming in hot and you'll need your net man to step in and snag your fish. You'll do this over and over and over again, expecting the same results until you achieve the number of fish you'll need for that fish taco dinner with the family. Silent Auction Items Needed

Silent Auction Donations—It is helpful to have a wide range of auction item values to involve all in bidding. Last year we had more items than ever before (thank you so much!), but fewer higher ticket items, and that impacted the overall success of the auction, so please continue to donate items of any value, but, if you can donate or have some contacts who could donate some higher ticket items, a few more of those than we had last year would be particularly helpful in achieving our silent auction goal.

Items can be received any time from now until Friday, June 7—Last year, more items than ever before were not given to anyone in advance and were brought to the auction site--most after the start of the auction—some as much as an hour after the auction had started with more late arriving members last year than ever before. This resulted in most people having completed their shopping and bidding before a good number of items even arrived. It hindered preparing for the amount of space needed and getting the majority of the silent auction bid sheets prepared in advance. The silent auction committee was therefore more engaged in continuing set up throughout the sale instead of bidding ourselves and encouraging others. It also resulted in more unsold items and items with only 1 starting bid on them than ever before.

Our next meeting will be June 22 and we are planning on having a speaker. The meeting, as usual, will be at 10 am...exact details will be e-mailed.








SAFETY FIRST!
